### **Budget no help for the poor, says Christian charity**

Church Action on Poverty (CAP) has attacked this week's Budget for ignoring the poor. Spending cuts are about to bite, yet the Chancellor offered no help, according to the charity. CAP coordinator Niall Cooper said: 'The Budget speech did not make a single mention of people in poverty ... The government has not kept its promise to protect the poorest and most vulnerable.' Family Action was equally dismissive. However, the Association of Christian Financial Advisers welcomed some measures, including the reduction in inheritance tax for people giving ten per cent of their estate to charity. Before the speech, the Baptist Union, Methodist Church and United Reformed Church had asked Mr Osborne to use it to apologise to benefit claimants. They said that last year he exaggerated benefit fraud.

### **Church leaders worry about Libya intervention**

Pope Benedict XVI called the Libyan situation 'worrying' and appealed for the protection of civilians and the free flow of humanitarian aid. The Catholic Bishop of Tripoli said the UN should have negotiated before intervening, and that the use of force was 'too hasty' and will only intensify Gaddafi's resolve. The Bishop of Exeter warned that Gaddafi's supporters were portraying the events as an attack on Muslims by the 'Christian West'. The Bishop of Croydon expressed his fear that the war would go on for a long time, and the Evangelical Alliance agreed there was a danger it could drag on to become 'another Iraq'. The head of Britain's military diocese, Bishop Richard Moth, urged the coalition forces not to overstep their commitment to protecting civilians.
