### **UN considers blasphemy law despite its abuse by states**

As the UN debated a global anti-blasphemy law, a Pakistani forced to flee his country due to the law there told of his experience. The unnamed man, talking to Christian Solidarity Worldwide, explained that he had helped Christians falsely accused of blasphemy – including a child – in the Punjab region. In attempting to defend them, he was shot several times. After naming his attackers in court, he and all his family had to leave Pakistan for the UK. In another incident, over 100 members of an Indonesian Christian church were forced to leave their homes after intimidation by an Islamic vigilante group. The church has appealed to the country's President. Meanwhile the UN Human Rights Council was considering a Muslim-backed resolution which would ban the defamation of organised religions.
